With the end of semester nearing, we would like to make you aware of the Awards Night we host at the end of the school year. Maple View recognizes outstanding students by awarding a series of academic and department awards.

GPA Awards are given to students who have academic excellence. There are two types of GPA recognition: 1) certificate for "career" GPA of 3.5-3.99, 2) plaque for "career" GPA of 4.0. The following "career" guidelines are used to determine the students who will be recognized:

- 6th grade students: first semester of 6th grade
- 7th grade students: BOTH semesters of 6th grade AND the 1st semester of 7th grade
- 8th grade students: BOTH semesters of 6th grade, BOTH semesters of 7th grade, AND the 1st semester of 8th grade

In order to receive recognition, the above must be met by the student for either a GPA of 3.55-3.99 or a GPA of 4.0. GPA is based on the actual GPA for each semester in Skyward and not an accumulation of GPA over the students' time at Maple View, therefore, each semester must but be a 3.5 or higher to receive these awards.

Department Awards are given by each of the many departments that make up the various classes. Teachers nominate students based on the following criteria: work ethic/improved work ethic, attitude in class, positive impact on class, and improvement in class grade. Students must have a minimum of a "C" on the semester report card.

Excellent Attendance Awards are given to those students with excellent attendance 1^{st} quarter, 2^{nd} quarter and 3^{rd} quarter. These students attended school EVERY day and were never tardy to class.

It looks like the crazy weather is going to break just in time for the weekend. I hope you are able to get out and soak up some vitamin D. This time of year we could all use a little sun. Have a great weekend. Go Bears!
