For those 6th grade parents that chose in-person hybrid this year.

This will be the first time the majority of our six graders will step foot on the Maple View campus. We are committed to creating a warm, inviting and welcoming experience for 6th grade students at Maple View Middle School. With this goal in mind, we have created a staggered start to in-person hybrid learning that will have only 6th graders on campus for the first two days, March 29th and March 30th. This will allow us to focus our efforts and wrap our support around our 6th graders to ensure that this transition goes as smooth as possible. We also are committed to doing this safely-making sure we following all of the current health guidelines.

Here are some of the supports you can expect during the first week for 6th graders.

- Once your student arrives to campus either from the bus or car, we have a terrific group of 8th grade WEB student leaders and staff members that will be eagerly awaiting to welcome them to Maple View.
- WEB students and staff will also direct them to attestation stations, the correct entrance point and finally to their classroom.
- During the first day of classes, you can expect teachers to review safety protocols, how to get to next classes and how to exit the building.
- WEB student leaders will also spend time in each of the 6th grade classrooms introducing themselves, checking in with 6th graders and sharing about our Arms Locked/Hearts Full approach.
- Between classes, WEB leaders and our staff will be handing out maps and directing kids to their next class.

Lastly, on Monday, please look for an email that will have a family checklist for in-person learning, a welcome video, and important FAQ's. We also will be incorporating *preparing for hybrid* lessons during homeroom next week.
